An alliance of North American recycled paint manufacturers has launched the International Paint Recycling Association (IPRA) to promote the quality, availability, and value of recycled latex paint.

IPRA is the first organization to represent the recycled paint industry, which over the past two decades has recycled more than 30 million gallons of unused

Twelve founding members with operations in more than 20 states and multiple Canadian provinces are combining their experience and expertise to highlight the role of recycled paint as a key component of the circular economy for architectural coatings.

About 10 percent of all paint purchased in the U.S. - about 78 million gallons per year - goes unused. About 80 percent of this paint is latex (water based), which can be turned into high quality recycled paint for use in a wide range of interior and exterior applications.

To boost awareness of the benefits of recycled paint, IPRA is developing the IPRA Green Standard® paint certification program to guarantee that certified products meet stringent performance standards. The organization has also launched RecycledPaint.org to answer common questions about recycled paint and to connect consumers with recycled paint companies.

Community Composting Workshop & Celebration












